RE: El-Sayed Has Wide Lead in Michigan Democratic Primary

A recent survey of likely voters in the Democratic Party Primary for U.S. Senate in Michigan shows Abdul El-Sayed opening up a wide lead.

Bottom Line: Abdul El-Sayed has a double-digit lead today over Chuck Schumer-endorsed Haley Stevens.

El-Sayed's lead is widespread. He leads in all media markets statewide, among both men and women, and he has more than a 2:1 lead among self-described "Liberal" voters, who account for two-thirds of the primary electorate. He also leads among all vote propensities, including among "perfect" Primary voters (those who vote in every Primary election) who make up nearly half of the electorate.

And El-Sayed has the name ID advantage today, scoring the highest "favorable" rating and the highest "net" favorable rating.

Methodology: 400 interviews were conducted (live calls and text-to-online) by Peak Insights, June 20-24, 2026, among a representative sample of likely 2026 Democrat primary voters statewide in Michigan. The margin of error is +/- 6% at the 95% confidence level.
